# **Community Partner Spotlight: Teresa Starkey Afterschool Reading Program**

## Bridging the Literacy Gap: A New Reading Program for Young Learners

At the Keene Housing Kids Collaborative, we know that reading proficiency by third grade is a critical milestone for long-term academic success. Yet, for many of the children we serve, transportation challenges and limited access to high-quality literacy support make this goal harder to achieve.

That's why we have partnered with Teresa Starkey to launch a new After-School Reading Program, bringing expert literacy instruction directly to where kids live. With small group sessions, this initiative ensures our youngest learners get the personalized support they need to build strong reading foundations—without the barrier of transportation.

### Meet Teresa Starkey: A Passionate Educator with 40 Years of Experience

We are incredibly fortunate to have Teresa Starkey leading this program. With over four decades of experience working with students of all ages, Teresa is a certified elementary educator and a reading and writing specialist. Her approach is rooted in creating a supportive and encouraging space where children can grow in confidence and skill. "My goal is to meet each child where they are and help them unlock the joy and power of reading. By building a strong foundation early, we are opening doors to lifelong learning," says Teresa.

### Why This Program Matters

The ability to read at grade level by third grade is a key predictor of future academic success, and yet, many children in low-income households fall behind due to fewer early learning opportunities. Through this program, students will:

☐ Strengthen phonics and decoding skills

☐ Build fluency and comprehension

□ Develop confidence and a love for reading

☐ Gain critical thinking and writing skills

They read *Willow the Therapy Dog* and *Murray's Miraculous Mission*, and we discussed how to prepare for a visit from a therapy dog.
